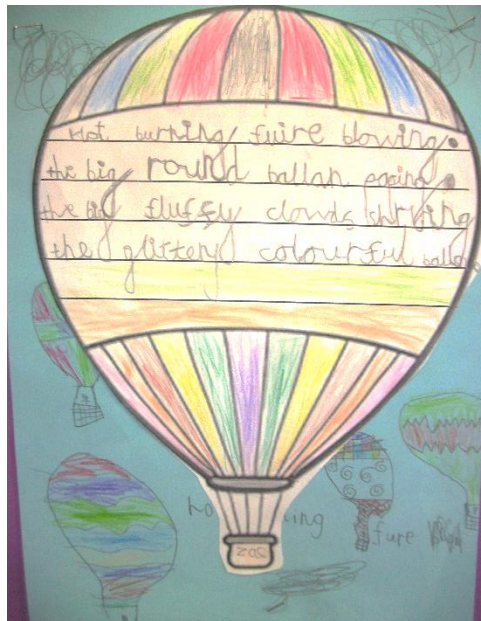

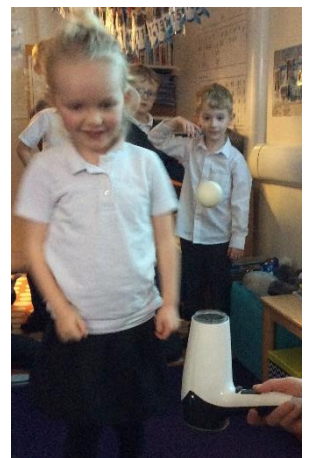
Skiff Class
