As you may know Mousehole School works with the HeadStart Kernow Partnership - a Cornwall Council led, Big Lottery funded programme to develop resilience and mental well-being in young people. Last year CCMH (The Centre for Child Mental Health) won the contract to continue this work with HeadStart. CCMH are delivering the work under the banner of Trauma Informed Schools using a tool called Motional. Our **Thrive** practitioners will be retraining to deliver this work with further training for all staff in time.

Traumatic experiences can be a part of all our lives and take many forms and Motional (Headstart's Wellbeing Profile) can be used for identifying, assessing, and improving the emotional health and wellbeing of children and young people. It is based on a combination of Professor Jaak Panksepp's research on emotional systems in the subcortical brain, Dr Margot Sunderland's expertise in executive functional skills and is supported by over 1000 studies and research papers, as well as a 17-year longitudinal study by Dr Margot Sunderland. — HeadStart Kernow.
