



# P.E and Sport Premium Funding Plans and Interim Review 2017-18

\* The PE and Sport Premium provides ring fenced money to primary schools to improve the quality of the PE and sport activities they offer their pupils.

\*All schools will receive a lump sum of £16,000 plus a premium of £10 per pupil.

\*Schools are free to determine how best to use this funding to improve the quality and breadth of PE and sport provision, including increasing participation in PE and sport, so that all pupils develop healthy lifestyles and reach performance levels they are capable of.

## Swimming

What percentage of your current Year 6 cohort swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres?	100%
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What percentage of your current Year 6 cohort use a range of strokes effectively? For example, front crawl, breast-stroke and backstroke.	75%
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What percentage of your current Year 6 cohort perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations.	75%
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Schools can choose to use the Primary PE and Sport Premium to provide additional provision for swimming but this must be for an activity over and above the national curriculum requirements. Mousehole School has chosen to provide top-up swimming for non or weak swimmers across the whole school, plus sea based swimming and surf lifesaving lessons.
