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AUTUMN RECIPE

How to make delicious hedgehog shaped bread rolls!

You will need:

- •500g of crusty bread mix
- •325ml warm water
- •36 chocolate drops
- •A handful of flour
- Greased baking sheet
- Damp tea towel
- Kitchen scissors

What to do:



Put the bread mix and water in a large bowl and stir. Knead for a few minutes on a floured surface and leave for the same amount of time. Separate the dough into 12 pieces and roll into a ball. Then, pinch a snout in each 'hedgehog'. Place on the greased baking sheet and cover with a damp tea towel, leave to rise for one hour. Ask a grown up to pre-heat the oven according to the bread mix instructions. Ask an adult to snip spines in each dough ball using scissors. Press chocolate drops in for eyes and nose. Ask your grown up to bake according to the bread mix instructions. Enjoy your breadhog!
