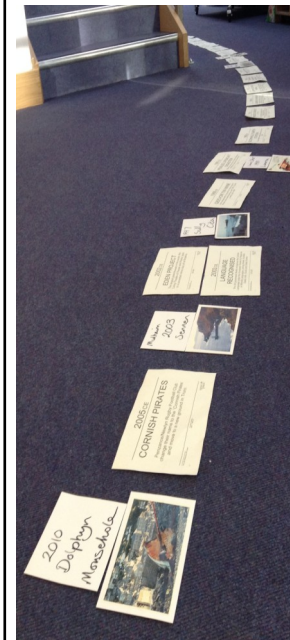

Curriculum News: part of our school improvement plan is to change the way we deliver parts of the curriculum to match the new primary curriculum and more importantly to increase its impact on children's learning. Each class team has planned this term's learning in a project based approach. Each project includes: a final exhibition of work to an authentic audience (including parents); a themed classroom environment (see the pictures below); essential questions e.g. Are all heroes good and all villains bad? Were the Ancient Greeks as clever as we think?



Despite polite reminders, we still have a small number of children arriving late to school.

School Starts at 8:50am. It is disruptive when children arrive late in to class and can be stressful for your child. Following a recent meeting with our Education Welfare Officer we will be keeping a record of children arriving late to school (after 8:50) and contacting the parents of persistent offenders.
