The children have worked in rotation with different teachers and visited Paul church where a team of volunteers set up some really interesting and thought provoking workshops and activities. The children have created peace doves and lots of different poppy based art work which we are looking forward to sharing with you during parent's consultations next week. The children have been learning about the significance of the poppy; they have used the book "A Child's Garden" by Michael Foreman to think about hope and reflect on their hopes; they have learnt about conditions in the trenches and the life of soldiers during World War I; they found out about rationing and the efforts communities went to in growing their own food; they placed poppies on a fishing net in the church with names of local men who died during World War I and thought about the impact some many lost lives would have had on a small community; the older children have also been looking in depth at poetry from the trenches and thinking about how soldiers used letters home to encourage their siblings not to "sign up" whilst trying not to worry their families about the horrendous conditions they were fighting in; Schooner Class have also learnt about the

plight of conscientious objectors who refused to fight on religious grounds. It has been a very busy and thought provoking start to this half term. We would like to thank our RE leader Mr Mullaney and Rev Andrew Yates and his team at Paul Church for all their efforts in creating such interesting workshops and activities.
